783. COUNCILLORS' REPORTS

County councillor Mandy Smith (by email) the county council will be putting up its part of the council tax by 1.99 per cent this year.

District councillor Mark Howell South Cambs' revenue support grant is being cut drastically over the next two years. To offset this, the council has set up a housing company that will put all its profit into the council tax pot, so the council is not dependent on government funds. It has invested seven million pounds in property, which it is letting out to the private sector at the market rate.

789. RECREATION GROUND - THIRD PARTY USE

The recreation ground and pavilion are used by the Fen Drayton Lions free of charge. The Lions however, reciprocate by cleaning the pavilion and carrying out emergency repairs and ad-hoc maintenance. The Lions also provide a free Christmas lunch every year for the over-65s, which is a highly popular and successful event. It was agreed that Swavesey Spartans should pay a fee for using the pitch to offset running costs (such as grass cutting, electricity and water). Extended use of the pitch, especially by boys and girls teams, was welcomed. Car parking will be monitored to ensure it doesn't impact on residents in High Street and Daintrees Road. R Lewis, seconded by I Whitby, proposed a fee of £200 per full season and £150 for this year based on usage indicated by David Rudderham in the open forum. All in favour.

ACTION: H Webster to draft a letter to David Rudderham and circulate for approval.

790. VILLAGE LANDSCAPING PROJECTS

HALL COURT: a bench has been ordered by the clerk for delivery on 19 February. H Webster to liaise with the handyman about fixing it in position next week. Tree purchasing is still in progress.

VERMUYDEN WAY TREES: Land Registry records show the land belongs to the parish council. Quotations for removal of all and some of the trees have been received and are being considered. The clerk will ask the tree officer if there are any constraints on removing the trees. D Cross spoke to the residents in Vermuyden Way who overlook the trees two years ago, but they should be consulted again. H Webster will speak to J Isden and J Christie to see if they have dealt with this recently. D Cross volunteered to canvas the households concerned again if required. D Cross will also compose a letter to Wilcon (the builders who planted the trees in 1987) to request a financial donation towards their removal.

- Clerk to contact the tree officer and to circulate quotations to all members.

COOTES LANE PLAYING FIELD: a parishioner has kindly offered to purchase and plant four black mulberry trees to replace the diseased lime trees that run parallel to his hedge in the playing field. I Whitby, seconded by V Hartop, proposed to accept the offer. All in favour.

791. A14 CAMBRIDGE-HUNTINGDON UPGRADE

An application for a Development Consent Order (DCO) has been made by the Highways Agency to the secretary of state. Any representations (giving notice of any interest in, or objection to, the application) must be registered by 12 March. An event to update/involve councils along the A14 development corridor is being held at the Menzies Cambridge Hotel on 4 March. H Webster or J Christie will attend along with one other, to be decided.

792. PAVILION REVOVATIONS

A Community Chest grant of £1000 has been awarded for refurbishing the showers. H Webster to speak to AA Taylor to see if his original quotation still stands. Clerk to obtain two other quotations. H Webster suggested a committee be formed to deal with more extensive upgrading of the pavilion and to investigate available grant monies, especially in view of increased usage by youth teams from outside the village. H Webster to investigate potential leaders for the project.
